Here is the third edition of a solid reference guide on books written on Guyana over the years since 1596 when Sir Walter Ralegh's volume on part of the country first appeared. It also includes books written by Guyanese and published in and out of Guyana on a range of other subjects.

This version contains almost 2,000 titles, well over 1,100 authors, and is comprehensively organized into one Index and three Appendices. So for the first time, there now exists a broad-based bibliographical reference showcasing the range of books on Guyana and by Guyanese writers. The titles are categorized into 73 subjects as follows:

## **About the Author**

Lal. Balkaran is a Certified General Accountant, Certified Internal Auditor, and an MBA from the Edinburgh Business School. He is generally perceived as an internal audit leader and is widely published across the globe. On top of this, he has authored seven reference books on business including an auditing dictionary titled A Practical Guide to Auditing & Related Terms (LexisNexis-Butterworths: Toronto, 2004) and a Directory of Global Professional Accounting and Business Certifications (Wiley: New Jersey, 2007). He also contributed a chapter to Professor Jeff Ridley's new book Cutting Edge Internal Auditing (Wiley: London, 2008). As to his native Guyana, Mr. Balkaran has written six reference books so far including an Encyclopaedia of the Guyanese Amerindians; A Photojournal of the Guyanese Amerindians; The Rupununi Savannahs; Timelines of Guyanese History; and Immigrant #99840 and Canecutter #7074: The Story of an East Indian Family in Guyana.
